CENTRAL — No matter how you look at it, the Daniel Lions had an off couple

of seasons.

The traditional powerhouse with five state championships to their name went 6-6 last year under newly appointed Head Coach Jeff Fruster who replaced Randy Robinson last April.

The Lions kicked off

season 2017 on Aug. 18 at home against Berkeley. The game was coached by — you guessed it — Randy Robinson.

Breaking in a new coach is never an easy task — both for players and the staff — but Fruster had the advantage of not being a total newcomer.

He had been a player at Daniel from 1995 through 1998 before joining the coaching staff in 2006 as a linebacker coach. In 2011, Fruster moved up to Defensive Coordinator before being offered the head job.

The 6-6 season can't be entirely blamed on having a new coach, at the end of the 2014 season Daniel graduated out a significant portion of their upper classmen players and were left sophomore heavy the following year.

In 2015, under Robinson, the Lions had their first losing season since 2006 and wrapped up the year with a frustrating 4-7 record.

But if the Lions are anything, they're predictable. The record books show a noticeable slump in the stats every four years — followed by a massive rebound.

In 2010 they went 7-5 and in 2006 the Lions went 4-7 — but it's the

years in between where the story lies: Following that 4-7 season, Daniel went 11-2, 13-1 and 13-1 in the next three After that 7-5? They went 11-2, 11-4 and 14-1.

EASLEY — This year is shaping up to be a make or break season for Easley High School Green Wave football as fans are eager to shake off their hit or miss reputation and finally delve back into being a football team with a serious eye

on a state championship. Expectations were high hen Easley High School Athletic Director Gil Payne announced John Windham would be taking the coaching helm in 2015. But since then, the team has skated by with a 6-5 record in Windham's first year, followed by a losing 5-6 record in his second.

Basically, there have been too many "close calls" for fans to gain any real encouragement despite talk that the team in on its way back to glory.

Now, it should go without saying that if you put 47 points up, you should not only be winning that game — but you should be spiking the ball in the end zone.


